Point #1

- Read Colossians 2:20-23. In what way was Paul essentially dealing with spiritual abuse?
- What was the root cause? (Hint: "human precepts") Why is this an important distinction to make?
- How can Point #1 apply to many Christian practices today? Give an example. How does it impact you?

Point #2

- Read Colossians 3:1-4. What was Paul implying by using words like "seeking", "set your minds on"?
- What is implied about being intentional? How does this ultimately relate to the Gospel of grace?
- Why will Point #2 keep grace in place? Be specific. How specifically will you step into Point #2 this week?

Daily Devotions

These are provided for mid-week personal spiritual growth. Prayerfully writing out your answers will help you experience real life transformation as you dig deeper into the spiritual truths of God's word and today's message.

MONDAY // Read Colossians 2:20-22, Galatians 2:18-3:1, Ephesians 2:8-9, 1 Peter 2:15, Romans 3:23-24

- Explain how Christians are spiritually set free from the law. (i.e., death and resurrection)
- In what way does this relate to God's grace? What does this imply about legalism? Be specific.
- Why is this important to recognize? What are some ways you have seen this happen today? What is the answer?

TUESDAY // Read Colossians 2:20-23, Isaiah 29:13, Romans 1:21-22, 12:16

- What three regulations did Paul present as being "human precepts" (i.e., traditions) in Colossians 2:21?
- Why would they have seemed spiritually wise? How can they actually have the opposite effect?
- What does this teach you about Christian traditions? What are some areas you may need to adjust?

WEDNESDAY // Read Colossians 2:20-23, 1 Corinthians 8:1-33, 1 Peter 5:5

- How was Paul's discussion in Colossians 2 and 1 Corinthians 8 dealing with similar topics? How were they different?
- In what way do you see this playing out in Christianity today? Give an example.
- Take some time to pray about this topic, asking God to show how you may have lost sight of His grace.

THURSDAY // Read Colossians 3:1-2, 2:11-13, Romans 10:5-15, 1 Peter 1:13

- Describe what Paul meant by seeking and setting your mind on "things above". Be specific.
- How does this ultimately relate to the Gospel of grace? What do Christians need to be intentional with this?
- How intentional have you been to promote grace? What practical steps will you take this week?

FRIDAY // Read Colossians 3:1-2, 1 Corinthians 15:9-11, Acts 26:1-32

- In what way was Paul's life continuously focused on "things above". Give an example.
- How did he use his conversion story to promote grace? Why is this important for every Christian to do?
- Briefly write out your personal testimony. How is God's grace on display? How can you share this today?

SATURDAY // Read Colossians 3:1-4, Philippians 3:20-21, 2 Thessalonians 1:10, 1 John 3:2

- What promise is Paul referring to in Colossians 3:3-4? In what way does God's grace provide this promise?
- How can this perspective prevent legalism from taking root? Be specific.
- What does this imply about promoting grace? How does this encourage you today?

MEDITATION VERSE: ¹ If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.

Colossians 3:1-2
